



Learnerships:

Evercomm offer talented candidates learnerships to prepare them for the workforce. However, candidates have to meet the requirements set out by the company and submit their application form on time to be considered. Learnership opportunities will be offered to people from different communities.

These learnerships are part of the government's National Skills Development Strategy to address the skills shortage, high unemployment and poverty in South Africa.

The learnership consists of both theoretical and practical training, the learnerships gets hosted by a approved Training and Skills company.

- Valid Matric certification
- Be a South African citizen
- Hold a valid ID document
- Between 18 and 35 years
- Positive, hardworking and be unemployed and/or employed by Evercomm
- Must be confident in English
- Proof of disability if applicable

Learnerships opportunities that become available will be updated on the company website from time to time.

Bursaries:

Evercomm offers bursaries to a certain number of students every year (full time and/or part time). It's a merit-based programme and the bursars are selected based on their academic performance and merit. Through the bursary programme Evercomm wants to improve the skill shortages in South Africa. Bursary values will be decided on a case-by-case basis and can cover the following expenses:

- Registration Fees
- Tuition Fees

To select candidates for the bursaries offered by Evercomm, Evercomm will lay out specific eligibility guidelines that are subject to change from time to time as funding becomes available. Anyone applying for the funding must review and fulfil all the eligibility criteria. Failing to do so can lead to rejection of the application.

Fulfilling all the requirements, however does not guarantee funding. Preference is given to those that belong to a designed groups and students with disabilities.

General eligibility requirements for bursary application:

- Must be a South African citizen
- Must be in between the age 19 and 35
- Must have a valid matric certificate
- Currently been studying or have applied to study at a recognized institution in South Africa
- Proven Financial Need
- Proof of disability, if applicable

Bursary funding and selection criteria will be updated on the company website from time to time when funding for bursaries becomes available.
